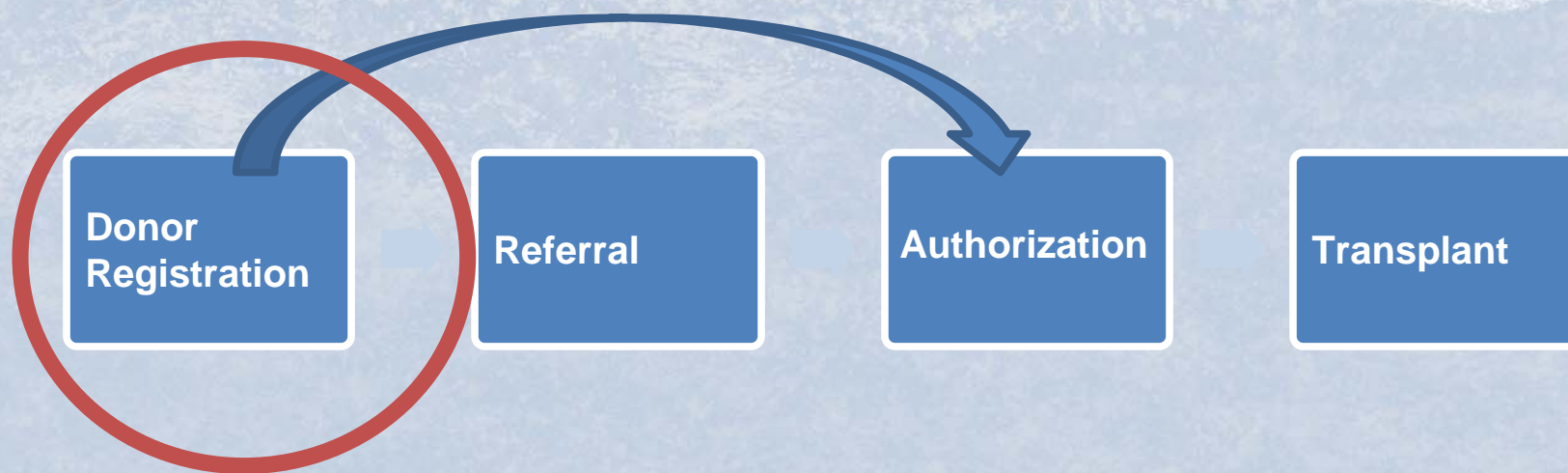

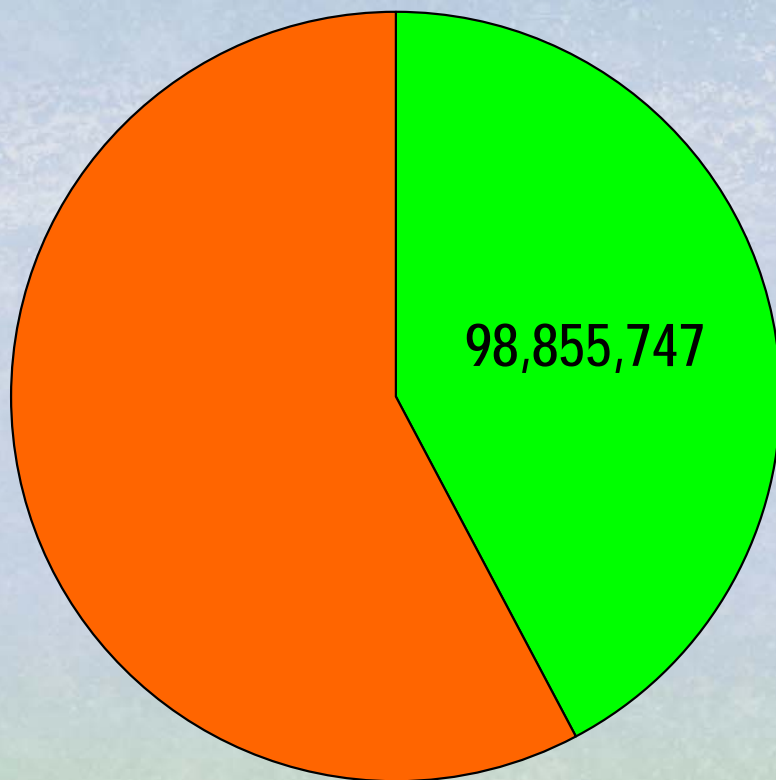
Donor Designation Collaborative Terms

Acronym	Definition
DD	Donor Designation = anatomical gift
DDR	Donor Designation Rate (%) (License/ID)
ADD	Actionable Donor Designation (number)
DOD, DTD, DED	Designated Organ Donor (Tissue, Eye)
Effective Registry	7 Best Practice Characteristics

Effective Registry Design Criteria

1	Enrollment not delayed	No follow up/confirmation required
2	UAGA Legislation	Upholds 1 st person authorization (www.anatomicalgiftact.org)
3	Effective registry searching	24/7 searchable
4	DMV enrollment	Enrolls donors via DL or ID cards
5	DMV records	Uploaded and searchable within 1 week of enrollment
6	Paper forms	Can enroll via paper forms
7	Online registration	Can enroll online

Signup Rate in Given Period of Time

Donor Designation Rate (DDR)

Rate at which individuals join the state donor registry expressed as a percentage of all drivers licenses and ID cards issued within a period of time

- Example: If a state issues 200,000 driver's licenses in a quarter, and 80,000 of these drivers check 'yes' to be designated donors, the quarter's donor designation rate is 40%

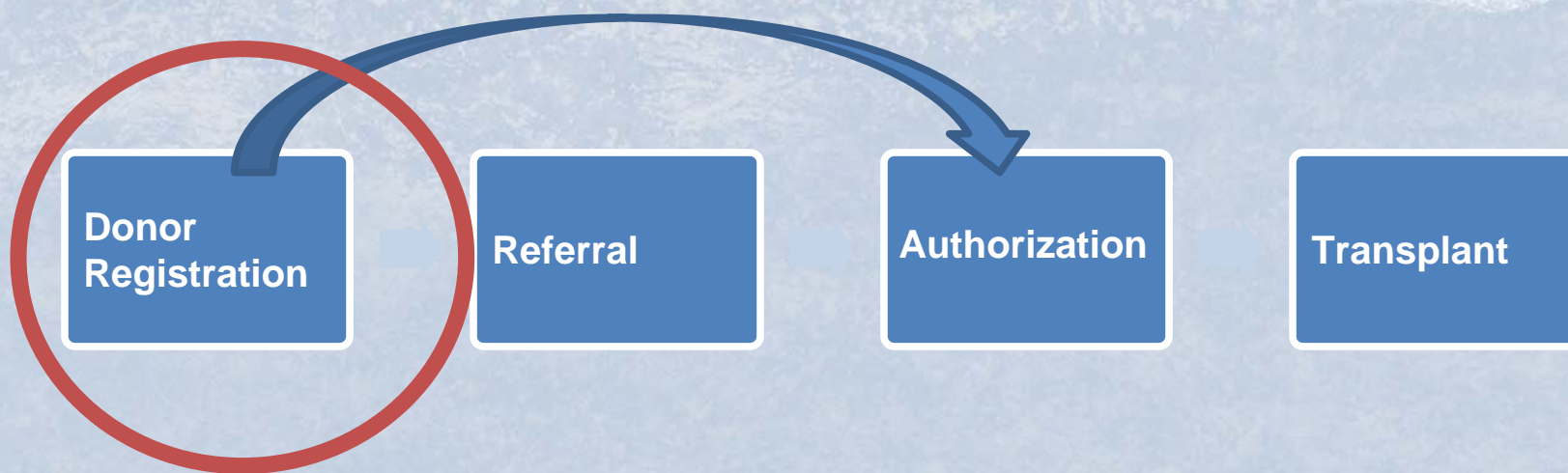

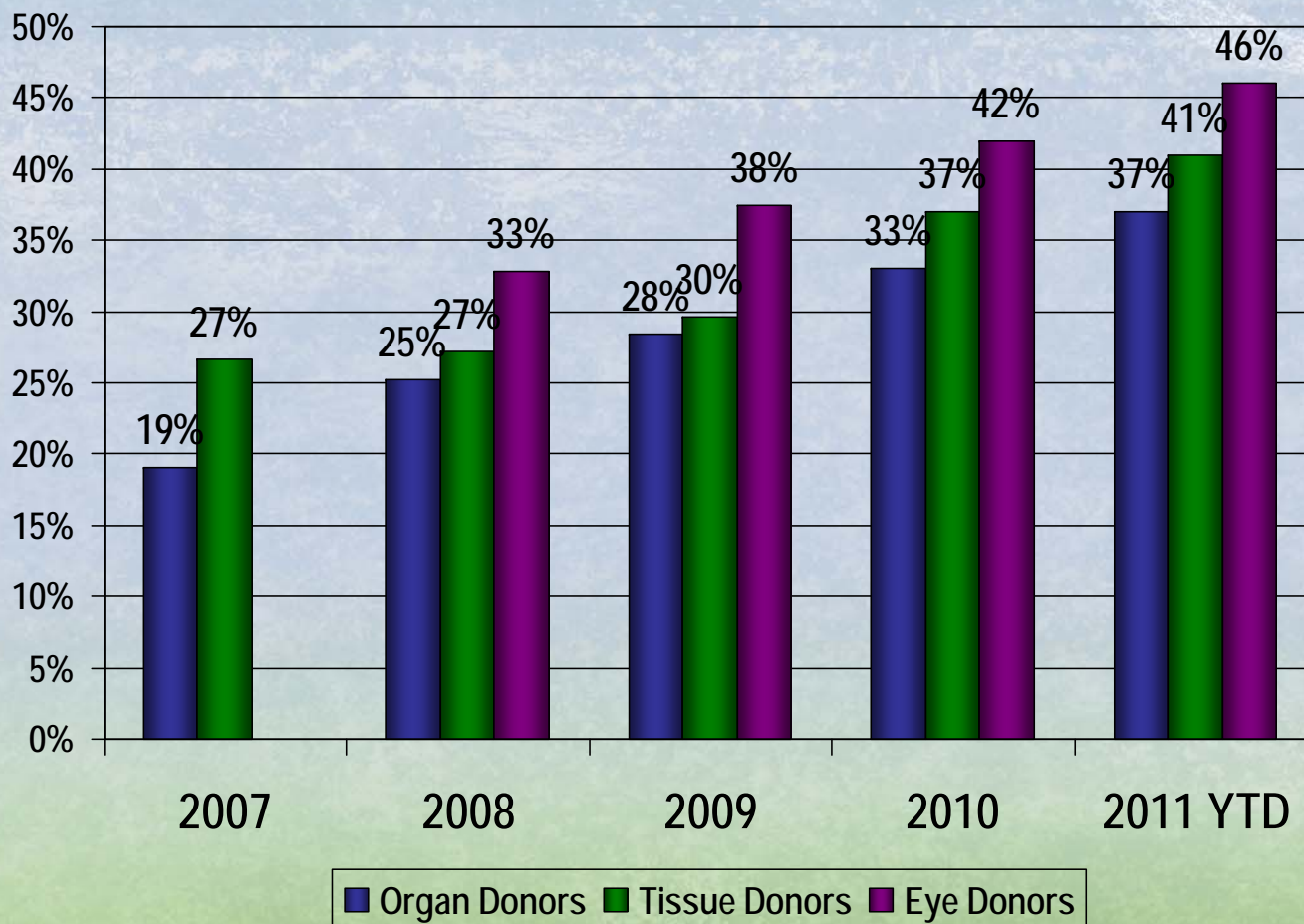

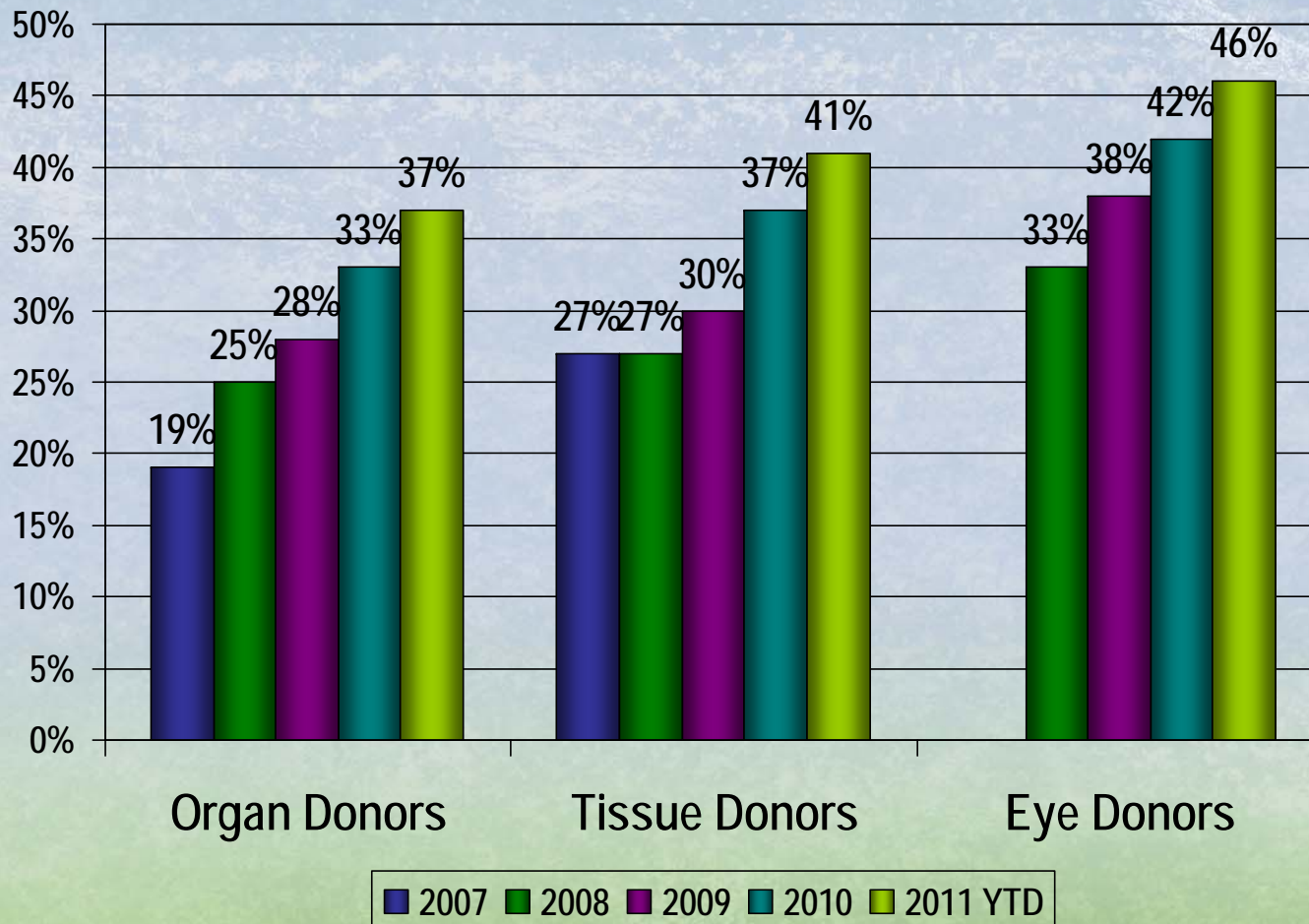
Impact on Donation, 2007-2011 Q2


